TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Alvin Community College

- *Theatre Director:* Responsible for the strategic vision and leadership of ACC Community Theatre. This involves season selection. Marketing, Community Outreach, Directing and Lighting Designing 5 shows a year.

University of Arkansas

- *Theater Appreciation*. A lecture course that serves as an introduction to theatre arts; play writing, directing, acting, history, and design. This course fulfilled a general fine arts credit for students.
- Acting 1 for Majors. I was chosen to pilot an introductory acting studio course for theatre majors, exploring the physical, vocal, and imaginative processes required for performance of dramatic texts, and building a vocabulary and technique for acting through exercises and scene work.
- Stage Speech. An introduction to basic skills of speech, voice production, and communication for performance and broadcasting. Special focus was on General American speech and the characteristics of speech regionalisms. The course explores breath control, resonance, articulation, pitch, volume, voice quality and stress management.
- University Perspectives (Provost Lecturer). A first-year "student success" course, this
 class is taught with both an online component and classroom activities. The course is
 designed to teach and encourage critical thinking and civic engagement. I was
 responsible for all online content as well as various individual lectures, and for the
 leading of discussions.

Trike Theater

- *Improv*. An introduction to the basic rules of short-form improv, with an emphasis in game playing. For ages 7–18.
- *Acting I.* Introductory Acting course that covers basic concepts, and introduces artists to objective, action, value adjustment, and imagination exercises. For ages 7 18.
- *Acting II.* Course topics include: vocal production, introduction to text analysis, and continued exploration of value adjustment, and imagination exercises.
- *Scene Study.* A course that teaches advanced acting technique, play analysis, and advanced character creation strategies.
- *Devising*. A course that takes students through the devising process, creating a new piece of theatre culminating in a series of public performances. Ages 14 19.
- Advanced Character Building. A course that enhances one's character-building abilities by focusing on movement profiles, vocal profiles, and advanced text analysis. For ages 7–18.
- *Production Camps*. These camps are three-week intensives that mimic a professional rehearsal process. With full technical support, these camps conclude with a four-performance run. For ages 12–18.
- Fine Arts Camps. An exploratory experience that focuses on various elements of fine

arts, and works to incorporate them into a multifaceted theatrical event.

• *The Next Gen Project*. An advanced yearly project that takes high school aged students through the process of writing, and producing their own work.
